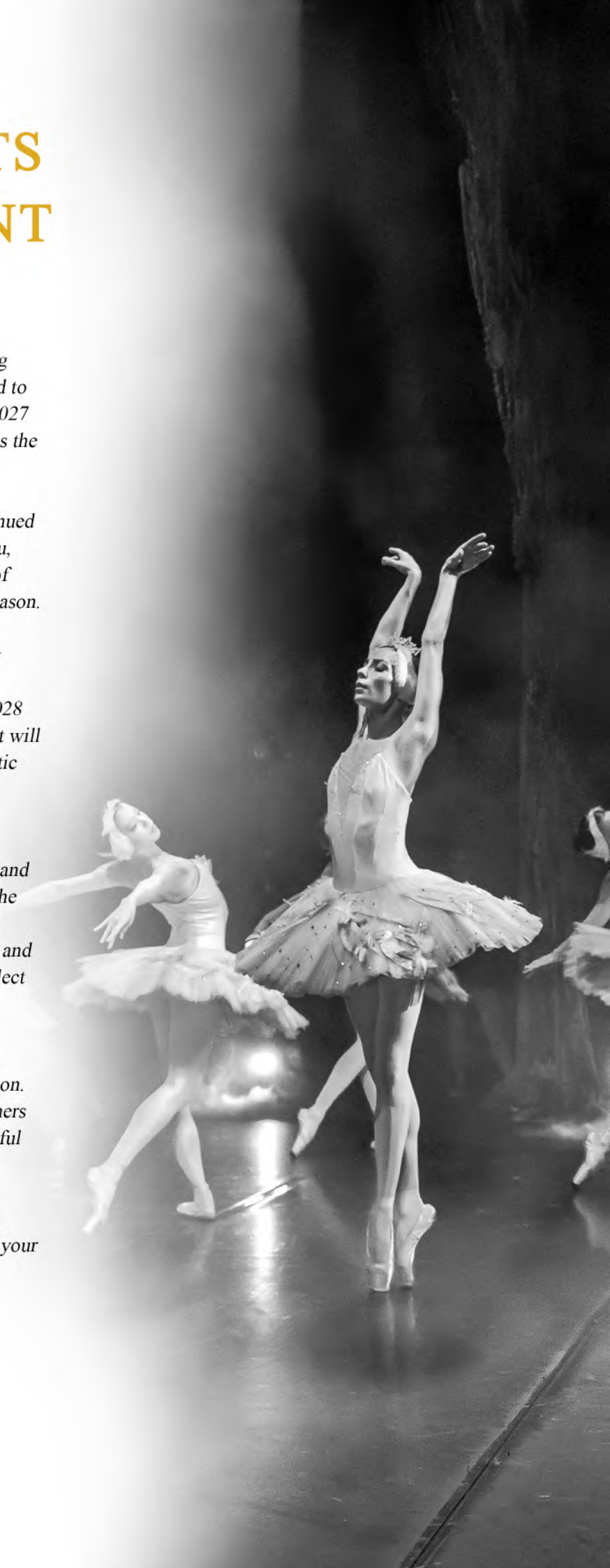

SYNOPSIS

PROLOGUE

The wicked magician Rothbart has put a curse on the beautiful maiden Odette and her friends, turning the girls into swans during the day – they are only human at night. Only a boundless true love can release them from the curse.

SCENE 1

In the garden in front of the castle, Prince Siegfried celebrates his coming-of-age party. The guests, ladies-in-waiting, and the prince's best friend, Benno, all rejoice. A hilarious Jester entertains everyone by dancing.

The reigning Queen, the mother of the prince, informs everyone that during the next day's ball Siegfried must choose a fiancée. Prince Siegfried is disappointed as he has not met a girl who he could love. It is growing dark. The guests leave the garden. Alone, Siegfried sees a flock of white swans flying high in sky, spurring him to hunt. Taking a crossbow, the prince goes into the forest.

SCENE 2

At the lakeside, Siegfried sees a white swan and draws his bow to shoot. Suddenly the swan transforms into Odette. Her beauty charms the Siegfried. Odette tells the prince of the curse. Siegfried professes his love and vows his devotion. The evil magician sees Odette and Siegfried together and decides to trick the prince into breaking his vows to Odette.





ACT II

BETRAYAL. STORM. REDEMPTION

**SCENE 3**

The ball has begun, but Siegfried is uninterested in any of the noblewomen dancing there. Baron von Rothbart and his daughter, Odile, arrive. Siegfried thinks Odile looks like Odette, but Benno does not agree. Siegfried asks Odile to dance and, enchanted by her, agrees to marry her. At that moment, Rothbart reveals himself as the evil magician, Odile laughs, and a white swan wearing a crown appears in the window. Siegfried runs out of the castle.

SCENE 4

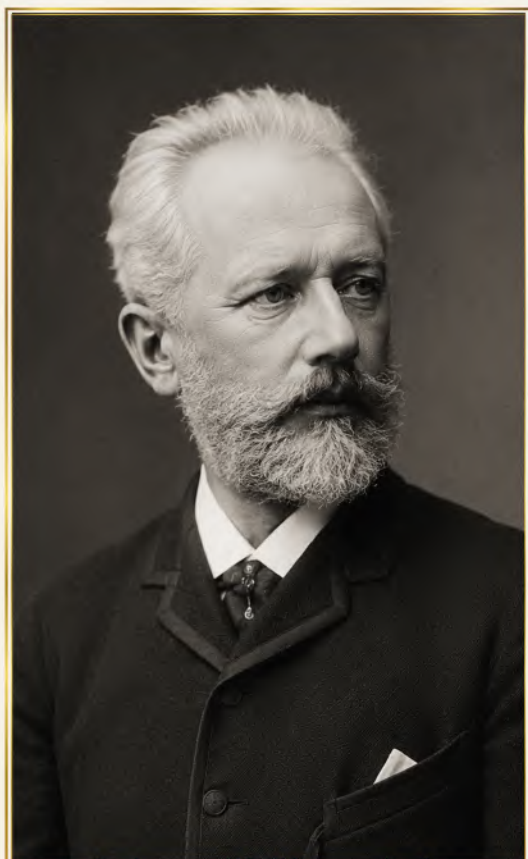
At the lakeside, Odette tells her friends about Siegfried's betrayal. Their hope to become free is lost forever. The curse of the evil magician has triumphed. The prince searches for Odette to beg for her forgiveness: he was convinced that Odile was actually Odette, and thought he was promising to marry her. Siegfried battles through a terrible storm Rothbart has created; and begins to fight him. Odette protects her beloved Prince from a deathblow, unwittingly breaking the curse with her love. The loving couple gladly meet the rays of the rising sun; Odette and her friends are human again.





PYOTR I. TCHAIKOVSKY

1840 - 1893



MUSIC IS
THE EMOTIONAL SHORTHAND
OF HUMANITY



Pyotr Il'yich Tchaikovsky was the author of some of the most popular themes in all of classical music. He founded no school, struck out no new paths or compositional methods, and sought few innovations in his works. Yet the power of his best music elevates it to classic status. It was Tchaikovsky's unique melodic charm that could, whether in his Piano Concerto No. 1 or in his ballet *The Nutcracker* or in his tragic last symphony, make the music sound familiar on first hearing.

Tchaikovsky was born into a family of five brothers and one sister. He began taking piano lessons at age four and showed remarkable talent, eventually surpassing his own teacher's abilities. By age nine, he exhibited severe nervous problems, not least because of his overly sensitive nature. The following year, he was sent to St. Petersburg to study at the School of Jurisprudence. The loss of his mother in 1854 dealt a crushing blow to the young Tchaikovsky. In 1859, he took a position in the Ministry of Justice, but longed for a career in music, attending concerts and operas at every opportunity. He finally began study in harmony with Zarembo in 1861, and enrolled at the St. Petersburg Conservatory the following year, eventually studying composition with Anton Rubinstein.

In 1866, the composer relocated to Moscow, accepting a professorship of harmony at the new

conservatory, and shortly afterward turned out his First Symphony, suffering, however, a nervous breakdown during its composition. His opera *The Voyevoda* came in 1867-1868 and he began another, *The Oprichnik*, in 1870, completing it two years later.

In 1869 Tchaikovsky entered into a working relationship with composer Mily Balakirev, leader of *The Five*; the result was Tchaikovsky's first recognized masterpiece, the fantasyoverture *Romeo and Juliet*. Other works were appearing during this time, as well, including the First String Quartet (1871), the Second Symphony (1873), and the ballet *Swan Lake* (1875).

In 1876, Tchaikovsky traveled to Paris with his brother, Modest, and then visited Bayreuth, where he met Liszt. By 1877, Tchaikovsky was an established composer. This was the year of *Swan Lake*'s premiere and the time he began work on the Fourth Symphony (1877-1878). The period of subsidy by Mme von Meck was abundantly productive for Tchaikovsky with a spate of outstanding compositions, including the *Serenade for Strings* (1881), *1812 Overture* (1882), and the Fifth Symphony (1888). In both 1888 and 1889, Tchaikovsky went on European tours as a conductor, meeting Brahms, Grieg, Dvřak, Gounod, and other notable musical figures. *Sleeping Beauty* was premiered in 1890, and *The Nutcracker* in 1892, both with success.

Written in 1876, it's a kaleidoscope of melodies, dancing, and folklore motifs. This is one of the most frequently staged ballets worldwide and paved the way for the legendary *The Nutcracker* and *Sleeping Beauty*.

Swan Lake grew out of a home performance?

Tchaikovsky's family staged an amateur performance, with the composer himself directing and choreographing. This homegrown fairy tale about a swan evolved into the masterpiece we know today.

Swan Lake became iconic after Tchaikovsky's death?

In 1895, Marius Petipa's staging at St. Petersburg's Mariinsky Theater became canonical, marking the ascension of Russian ballet to global fame.

The Dance of the Little Swans is the most famous dance in the world?

Even if you've never seen *Swan Lake*, you've likely heard its music and seen excerpts of this iconic dance, a highlight of Russian ballet and a favorite for parodies.

There are two different endings to Swan Lake?

Trained at the National College of Choreography in Chişinău under renowned ballet teacher Andrey Litvinov, Sergei Zdanschi began his professional career with the National Opera and Ballet Theatre of Moldova while still a student, quickly gaining recognition for his strong technique and expressive stage presence.

He later performed as a Leading Ballet Soloist in Dnipro, Ukraine, where he debuted as Prince Siegfried in Swan Lake, establishing himself as a promising classical dancer.

Sergei has toured internationally across Europe and Asia, appearing on stages in France, Germany, Italy, Spain, Switzerland, Sweden, and China. His repertoire includes leading roles in Swan Lake, The Nutcracker, The Sleeping Beauty, and other classical ballets.

Today, Sergei Zdanschi performs as a Principal Dancer with Classical Arts Entertainment.



**ILONA
BAITLER**

Trained at the Dnepropetrovsk Theater and Art College and the Dnepropetrovsk School of Classical Dance, Ilona Baitler quickly gained recognition for her strong classical technique, musicality, and expressive stage presence.

In 2020, she joined Classical Arts Entertainment, becoming one of the company's leading artists and performing extensively across Europe, including France, Germany, Switzerland, and Poland. Her repertoire includes principal and soloist roles such as Odette/Odile in Swan Lake, Aurora in The Sleeping Beauty, Cinderella in Cinderella, Clara in The Nutcracker, Kiti in Don Quixote, and Mavka in The Forest Song.

Ilona is also a prize winner of several international ballet competitions in Ukraine. Today, she performs internationally as a Principal Dancer, captivating audiences with her elegance, refined technique, and dramatic interpretation of classical roles.

NADURBEK**

Trained at the Bishkek Choreographic School under renowned teacher Uran Sarbagyshev, Kanat Nadurbek Uulu began his professional career with the Kyrgyz National Opera and Ballet Theatre named after Abdylas Malydybaev.

Early in his career, he toured extensively across Europe and Asia, performing in nearly forty countries, and later worked with Universal Ballet in Seoul, South Korea.

In 2016, Kanat joined the Primorsky Stage of the Mariinsky Theatre in Vladivostok as a soloist and was promoted to Principal Dancer in 2018, becoming the first Kyrgyz dancer in history to achieve this rank at the Mariinsky Theatre.

His repertoire includes leading roles in Swan Lake, Giselle, The Sleeping Beauty, Romeo and Juliet, and Le Corsaire. In 2019, he was awarded the honorary title of Honored Artist of the Kyrgyz Republic.



**RAVSHAN KYZY
SUIUMKAN**

Ravshan Kyzy Suiumkan is an internationally active classical ballet dancer recognized for her expressive stage presence, refined technique, and versatility across both lyrical and virtuoso repertoire.

She received her professional ballet training in Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan, specializing in classical technique, pointe work, and pas de deux. Following her graduation, she performed internationally with touring ballet companies across Europe and the United Kingdom.

Her repertoire includes principal roles in Swan Lake, The Sleeping Beauty, The Nutcracker, and Cinderella.

Ravshan has appeared in numerous international ballet productions and festivals and is the recipient of awards from competitions in Kyrgyzstan, Kazakhstan, Germany, and France. Today, she continues to perform internationally as a principal and soloist artist.

STETSENKO**

Beginning her ballet training at the age of seven in Kyiv, the Ukrainian ballerina later graduated from the Kyiv State Choreographic School in 2019 and began her professional career with the Lviv National Opera before joining the National Opera of Ukraine.

In 2022, she received a contract with Semperoper Dresden in Germany, and since 2023 has performed as a leading dancer with the Grand Kyiv Ballet. In 2025, she joined the ballet troupe of Classical Arts Entertainment.

A finalist and prizewinner of international ballet competitions in Kyiv, she has toured extensively across Europe, Australia, New Zealand, and the United States, performing a wide range of classical repertoire. Her repertoire includes leading and soloist roles in Swan Lake, The Nutcracker, Sleeping Beauty, Giselle, Don Quixote, The Snow Queen, and Forest Song, demonstrating both lyrical artistry and strong classical technique.

The Program has grown into a 30+ Partner Studios that perform throughout the East Coast Tour every year. Classical Arts Entertainment casts student dancers ages 5-18 in ancillary roles performing alongside the professional ballet dancers. A wide variety of parts for young dancers is offered during the Grand National Tour 2026/2027, in such repertoire, as: Classical arts entertainment I Love to Dance Program Director and Producer, Michael Art, plays a central role in supporting and developing young dancers who share the stage with professional artists in productions including **The Nutcracker, Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs, Cinderella, Sleeping Beauty, and Swan Lake.**

Under his direction and creative leadership, **I Love to Dance** partner studios audition and rehearse thousands of local ballet students in tour cities each season. During the 2026 to 2027 Winter and Spring tours across the United States, more than 5000 students are expected to participate, gaining meaningful stage experience and professional-level preparation.

The **I Love to Dance** program is designed to prepare young performers for confident, high-quality appearances alongside an international company of professional ballet artists, offering practical production experience, artistic growth, and memorable opportunities on major theater stages.
